For example, we needed to get close to forty tables from St. Joseph's to the Toy Distribution site on Main St. on Sat. Nov 25th. After a few calls, we had nine people show up,

five of them with pick up trucks and we moved the tables and set them up in less than half an hour. Special thanks to Larry Belair, Ken Akerley, Chanel Simard, Paul St. Amand, Scott Routhier, Joe Stafford, Kevin LaPierre and Dick Collopy for helping me out in getting this done. Most of the toys that we have so far have been set up on the tables and all we are waiting on now are for the toys to start coming in. In addition to the giving trees from our Parishes and local banks and businesses, we also get many toys from local drop offs and the toys for tots program. Our biggest need as always, is help with the distribution of the toys themselves. We had set the dates this year for Monday Dec 18th and Wednesday Dec 20th. We will start at 6:00PM and will probably be done around 8:30. Those wishing to help on Wednesday and also would like to go to the 4th Degree meeting the same evening can still spend an hour and a half helping us out and still attend the meeting. It is important that you let me know if you plan on helping out on one or both of these nights. I need to schedule the personnel. Depending upon how many applicants we have this year, I may need some people both nights or just one. I will be getting back to everyone who volunteers to confirm when you are scheduled. We also have a number of members so far who have volunteered to help receive the volumes of food during the day on Thursday Dec 21st in preparation of the packing of food baskets that evening at Rockingham Park. We put together over 225 baskets and it is a large undertaking. We could use more help with the receiving and in particular with the packing at night. Call George Masciarelli at 603-893-3035 if you can help with the receiving during the day and he can give you the details. Finally, after everything is done, we need to pack up any excess toys (we always have some late arrivals for next year) and get

them to the storage container and bring the tables back to St. Joseph's. This needs to be done prior to New Years as there is a party at St. Joseph's and they need the tables. I have scheduled Saturday Dec 30th to pick up the tables and will need a number of volunteers for that. Again, call me if you are available. I would like to try and pack up the excess toys during the week but do not have a date set for that as I will need to get a better feel for what will be left over. Again, if you can help out at all or any of the events, please contact us so that we can plan ahead. This is a very large project and one that is heartwarming for the recipients and especially for those of us who participate.
