(2) Deceased member's family of Council 4442, in good standing at passing, are eligible for the general scholarship up to 5 years after his death. (3) That an Applicant must be attending a Bachelor degree program through an accredited College or University on a FULL time basis. (4) Automatic \$500.00 scholarship award to Squires who meet the eligibility requirements (funds taken from the general scholarship coffers), and (5) The Council will offer an automatic \$500.00 scholarship to Seminarians who meet eligibility requirements. Awarded checks for the grants shall be made payable to the recipient as soon as possible, after selection. Annual Tootsie Roll Drive

The annual Tootsie Roll Drive was a huge success. Once again yellow aprons and buckets were all over the town of Salem on April 27th, 28th and 29th. Volunteer Knights and their families collected approx \$12,000.00 for the Mentally Challenged and Handicapped Population of the Greater Salem Area. Special THANKS to Alan and Janet Phair, Joan Bryant, Will and Gertrude Bamford, Al Hamel, Peg Akerley, Bill Silvestri, Gene Bryant, Matt Bryant, Chanel Simard and Chairman Ken Akerley and all of the Knights and their families numerous to mention.

Tootsie Roll Drive - Part II (or, "Every dark cloud has a silver lining.") The weather on the

weekend of our Tootsie Roll drive was not the best - cold, overcast, some showers. So although our council did well with the drive, we did not "sell out" our supply of Tootsie Rolls. What to do with the leftovers? -- Send them to our troops overseas!

The remaining Tootsie Rolls were packaged up and shipped to four contacts in the Middle East. SPC Katie Christof and Cpt Mike Brumley, both of the 10th Mountain Division, are serving in Iraq; LTC Donna Martin and Medic Bobby Silva are both serving in Afghanistan. We do not know these folks personally; they are not our relatives, but they are "our soldiers." Each person is a contact point who distributes packages they receive to others in their units and to local children in hospitals and orphanages. (More details on the logistics of how this works are at the web site "anysoldier.com".)

The bottom line: we have sent out packages to these soldiers, containing 6,400 Tootsie Rolls; the total weight was over 250 pounds. -- That's a lot of Tootsie Rolls -- and a lot of smiles!

On a side note:

Austrian immigrant Leo Hirshfield brings to the U.S. his recipe for a chocolaty, chewy candy, which he begins producing in a small store in New York City. Hirshfield names the candy after his five-year-old daughter, whose nickname is "Tootsie."

From a U.S. Marine's personal web site: Do you remember all the Tootsie Rolls that were dropped by parachute? Did you know why? The modest Tootsie Roll has

played a significant "roll" in the U.S. military history, having been included in armed forces rations since the days of World War I. Over the years, care packages assembled by community organizations have shipped countless additional Tootsie Rolls to soldiers overseas.

Known as a source of quick energy, the candy became highly valued by the troops for its ability to withstand severe weather conditions. In Operation Desert Storm, for example, soldiers serving in Saudi Arabia reported that Tootsie Rolls were the only chocolate candy able to survive the extreme heat without melting or crystallizing. Forty years earlier, U.S. soldiers in Korea found that Tootsie Rolls were the only food they could thaw during temperatures of -30 degrees below zero. In 1950, the radio code word for 60 MM mortar ammunition was, "Tootsie Roll." To prevent the enemy from learning that ammunition was running low,

American troops battling in the Chosin Reservoir in North Korea would radio, "We need more Tootsie Rolls." One such transmission was translated verbatim by the radioman at the airstrip. When the next airdrop was made, parachute packs floated down with - Tootsie Rolls. The besieged Marines, their rations frozen solid, made the best of the situation. They tucked away Tootsie Rolls in their clothes, where they remained soft enough to eat.

Tootsie Roll Industries has

received numerous testimonials of how Tootsie Rolls have actually helped save the lives of service personnel who were near starvation. One "Chosin Few" Marine [of the Korean War] wrote, "By large, Tootsie Rolls were our main diet while fighting our way out of the Reservoir. You can bet there were literally thousands of Tootsie Roll wrappers scattered over North Korea. No doubt it made a nice change from Spam."

Hall Rental Policy Contact & New Key Entry

Please note that if you are interested in renting the hall, you should contact George Masciarelli at 603- 893-3035. During the winter months, Chanel Simard should be contacted at 603-898-4950. The basic charge is \$125 plus an additional \$100 deposit that will be returned if you leave the hall in the shape it was in when you rented it.

If you wish to use the Pots and Pans along with the dishes etc, there is an additional \$100 fee which is non-refundable. A calendar is maintained in the Council Home with dates for all rentals and Council events. **It is not the bible however, so you**

need to check with the rental manager before you plan an event to make sure the date is open. Just because someone puts a date down on the calendar does not mean that it has been confirmed with the rental manager. Remember, unless it is an actual Council event, no lit candles are allowed on the tables as part of a centerpiece. We have also put in new thermostats which are automatically set at 60 degrees. If you are using the hall and want to reset the heat, you need to reset it by touching the hold button and moving the arrow key until you reach your desired temperature. You should reset it back by bringing it back down to 60 before you leave. The system does have an auto override that will automatically reset the system to 60 at 6:00AM and 6:00PM. Keep this in mind if you are in the hall in the afternoon and your party will be overlapping past 6:00PM. You will need to reset it again. Hopefully this will save us energy costs as we had many people leave the heat on high accidentally and it stayed that way for days.
